Why we are marching:

This Government and the previous Coalition have set out to dismantle the Welfare State and destroy all our public services with £billions in cuts and privatisation. Tens of thousands campaigners round the country are fighting to stop them.

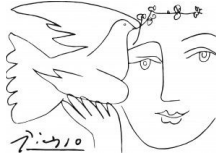
The march will bring communities from across Brighton and Hove and beyond together in a huge show of solidarity to tell Government and Brighton and Hove Council that we will not accept attacks on our public services which are depriving people of basic rights and killing them.

- One in 200 people in the UK are homeless. The numbers of people having to sleep rough has doubled since 2010.
- £50 million to be cut this year from NHS services in this region. Many services privatised or sold off; staff under pressure; bullying and discrimination on the rise; growing waiting lists and cancellations of operations.
- Over 4 million children are living below the poverty level. Infant and child mortality on the increase.
- Life expectancy is in decline for the first time since WW2. Tens of thousands people dying directly as a result of austerity measures.
- Continued attack the rights of migrants (however long they have lived in this country) with the latest assault on migrants' right to healthcare and illegal sharing of personal information.
- Mental health services and Social Care services for young people, people with disabilities and the elderly on the verge of collapse.
- The Government's inhuman benefits system causing untold misery, depriving particularly the elderly and people with disabilities, of incomes and services.
- Nearly three quarters of secondary schools are now privately-run academies. Funding for state schools has been slashed.

All in the 6th richest country in the world.
